The Scientific Program Committee of the Western Branch of the Canadian Psychoanalytic Society is pleased to announce the four part series for 2010. In January, Dr. Endre Koritar will present a review of theoretical concepts developed by Klein, Bion, Fonagy and Lacan in the treatment of regressed patient. He will illustrate these concepts with clinical material drawn from the dynamic therapy of a schizophrenic man over an 8 year period. Second in the series in May is Dr. William Fried from New York. His paper will discuss the effects of planned separations in patients, the usefulness of these effects on the treatment process, our countertransference reactions to leaving our patients, and some technical considerations in working through separation reactions. In September, Dr. Paul Steinberg will examine the use of dreams as an indicator of progress within the analytic process. Finally, Dr. Elie Debbane will discuss the concept of envy, which occupies a central place in Kleinian Theory as it relates to narcissism and the destructive impulses.
